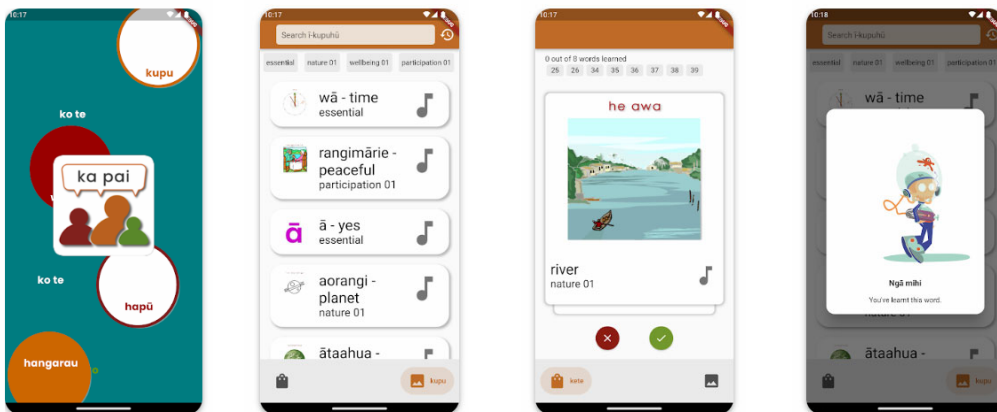

Over the last 15 years, the Kapai Group have worked with educationalists, and fluent speakers to ring-fence all the vocabulary in the learning areas for: manaakitanga (hospitality); taiao (nature); hauora (wellbeing); whai wāhi (participation); auaha (creativity); toi (art); hangarau (technology); matihiko (digital); kīwaha (idioms); waiata (song); and whakataukī (proverbs).
