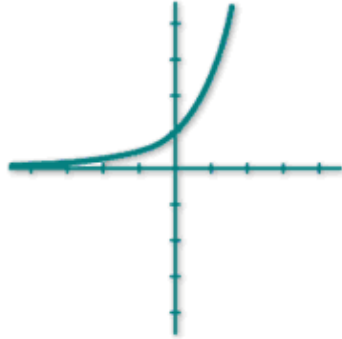

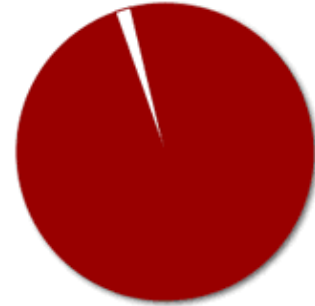

For this, you and your whānau need access to free to use, free to share resources that are:

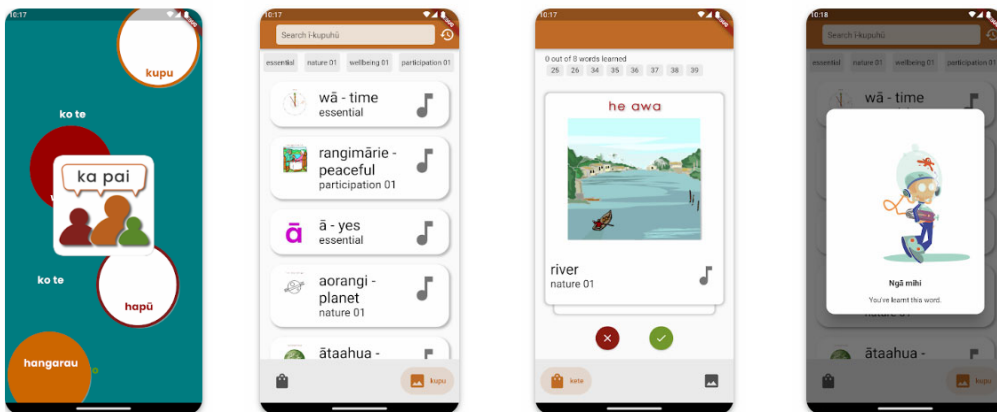
- **Shareable** so you and your friends can learn on the same page at the same time.

- **Trackable** for registered learners, we can generate reports that list: what you learnt; when you learnt, and what you downloaded.

Features of the kapai group i mahi pai—bubbling word app

The i mahi pai bubbling word app allows learners 24/7 access, to audio visual learning of 14,400 te reo māori words and contextual phrases.

Over the last 15 years, the Kapai Group have worked with educationalists, and fluent speakers to ring-fence all the vocabulary in the learning areas for: manaakitanga (hospitality); taiao (nature); hauora (wellbeing); whai wāhi (participation); auaha (creativity); toi (art); hangarau (technology); matihiko (digital); kīwaha (idioms); waiata (song); and whakataukī (proverbs).
